



WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN (WIC) PROGRAM

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), is a supplemental nutrition program focused on healthy eating for moms, babies and kids.

CEDA AND WIC

CEDA operates 19 WIC clinics in the Chicago and suburban area and serves over 48,000 participants every month, making it the largest WIC program in Illinois.

Clients are eligible for all WIC benefits, including personalized counseling with a Nutritionist, and individual and group education. Breastfeeding Peer Counselors are also available to help and support breastfeeding mothers.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for WIC, you must either be: pregnant, breastfeeding, have had a baby in the past 6 months, or have a child younger than five years old. You or your child must also have a health or nutrition risk and meet income guidelines (see chart).

Parents, legal guardians or caretakers who have medical and financial responsibility for a child may apply for WIC benefits. To see if you or your family is eligible, call one of the offices listed and speak to a WIC staff person.
